



## Sports Betting Integrity Policy for TT Elite Series

1. **Policy Scope**: The following rules shall apply to all competition stakeholders, including competitors/players, coaches, trainers, officials, event staff, or any other person associated with games or events who possesses privileged information.
2. **Sports Betting**: Competition stakeholders shall not engage, nor attempt to engage, in any sports betting activity relating in any way to any TT Elite Series event. Competition stakeholders shall also not instruct, permit, cause, or enable other individual(s) to engage, or attempt to engage, in any sports betting activity relating in any way to any TT Elite Series events. This rule applies to all sports betting activities including, without limitation, those available in any gambling facility, casino, on the internet or electronically, or in all other establishments and locations.
3. **Manipulation of Events**: Competition stakeholders may not be involved with the offering, giving, acceptance, or receipt of a bribe, gift, or any type of consideration, financial or otherwise, that could improperly influence, manipulate, or “fix” any TT Elite Series event in any way. Competition stakeholders are similarly prohibited from influencing, manipulating, attempting to influence or manipulate, or requesting or instructing others to influence or manipulate any TT Elite Series event in any way such that the outcome or any other aspect of the event is determined by anything other than the competitors’ merits.
4. **Inside Information**: Competition stakeholders are prohibited from requesting or disclosing, directly or indirectly, any non-public information that could potentially provide an advantage in sports betting activities (e.g., injury information) to any person that does not have a legitimate need to know such non-public information. Individuals may violate this provision whether they know or reasonably should know that the non-public information in question could potentially be used for the purposes of sports betting activities.
5. **Obligation to Report**: Competition stakeholders must report suspected, anticipated, or known violations of this Sports Betting Integrity Policy, without undue delay and unprompted at the first available opportunity, to TT Elite Series leadership and/or on-site TT Elite Series officials. Stakeholders must report such information whether they are directly involved with the matter or should have reasonably been aware of the matter. Retaliation against any individual who, in good faith, reports such a matter is strictly prohibited.
6. **Obligation to Cooperate**: Competition stakeholders are obligated to cooperate and affirmatively participate in any internal or external investigation of a violation of this Sports Betting Integrity Policy.



## Escalation Standard Operating Procedure for TT Elite Series

The standard operating procedure is outlined below:

1. TT Elite Series receives a report of an alleged, suspected, or anticipated violation of its Sports Betting Integrity Policy. This report may originate from Sportradar, a competition stakeholder (i.e., whistleblower), a betting operator, or another source.
2. While TT Elite Series will intake and assess all sources of information, as appropriate, to determine whether to take action regarding an alleged rules violation, the below sources will generally be regarded as the most credible and of the highest-priority:
  - a. Betting Patterns & Monitoring (i.e., Sportradar)
  - b. Direct Reports from Bookmakers
  - c. Competition Stakeholders / Whistleblowers
  - d. Competition/Match Action

TT Elite Series will also intake and assess other sources of information, such as concerns or rumours emanating from social media or journalists, but will apply particularly strict scrutiny and filtering to such reports and allegations and will typically require some form of corroboration prior to taking action.

3. *For Reports Received Before Events:* If the report is from one of the high-priority sources listed above and poses a credible and serious threat to the integrity of an upcoming event, TT Elite Series should consider immediately notifying the implicated competitors of the report. In this instance unless the competitors are able to provide a wholly satisfactory explanation of the information contained in the report, TT Elite Series shall consider postponing/cancelling the upcoming event or rescheduling the event so as to exclude any implicated competitors from participating. Following the cancellation, rescheduling or completion of the event, TT Elite Series will conduct a thorough investigation into the matter, utilizing support from Sportradar where needed.

*For Reports Received During Events:* Unless it is determined that any party's physical safety may be at risk or the report is otherwise deemed to be extremely urgent, TT Elite Series will allow the event to conclude before following the approach outlined immediately below.

*For Reports Received After Events:* If the report is deemed credible, TT Elite Series will conduct a thorough investigation, utilizing support from Sportradar where needed.

Please note that TT Elite Series reserves the right to inform law enforcement or other potentially affected authorities in case of credible and serious criminal implications.
